#### **Brief Description**

In this subject the student must complete a professional and original piece of work based on the content that they have studied and that follows the methodical scientific method. It can be focused on one or more of the themes that the student finds the most interesting and feasible to complete according to their activity. For this reason, each student will have the assistance of a tutor who will set guidelines to follow. It involves the completion of an original piece of work by each student which summarizes the acquired training and should reflect the application and development of knowledge and skills related to the specialized course. It should relate, therefore, to what was generally learned in the module and what was specifically learned during the external work placement.

- Scientific articles, which will be shared on the Virtual Campus and will be related to each of the subjects. Forums will be used to ask questions for reflection and practical application of each of the articles.
- Supporting documents, which will also be shared on the Virtual Campus or can be requested by students who search for them via information and communication technologies.

#### **Tutorials**

These tutorials have the aim of consolidating knowledge and abilities taught in the classes of the subject,

at the same time will help to solve problems and doubts asked by the students. There will be an assessment and follow up of the different tasks in order to contribute to the understanding of the subject methodology and systems of assessment.
